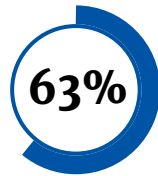

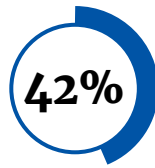

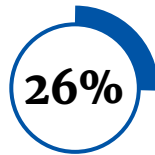


of UConn undergraduates are CLAS majors

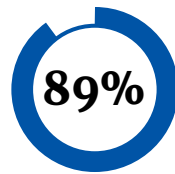


of UConn graduate students are in CLAS programs

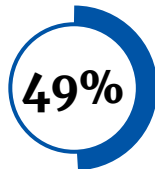


of the Class of 2025 reported positive career outcomes 6 months after graduation
